This month, our PBIS (Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports) focus is on **Gratitude and Giving**—two powerful values that help build a caring, respectful, and positive school community!

♡ What Gratitude and Giving Look Like at School

Students are learning that gratitude means noticing and appreciating the good things around us — from kind words to helping hands. Giving means sharing our time, talents, and kindness with others. At school, this looks like:

- Using kind words and manners saying "thank you," "please," and "you're welcome."
- **Showing appreciation** writing thank-you notes to teachers, staff, or classmates.
- **Helping others** offering to include someone at recess, helping a classmate with work, or assisting in the classroom.
- Participating in school-wide acts of giving such as food drives, donation collections, or classroom service projects.

Teachers and staff will be recognizing students who demonstrate gratitude and giving through PBIS tickets, shoutouts, and classroom celebrations!

You can help reinforce this month's theme by:

- **Modeling gratitude** share what you're thankful for each day at dinner or bedtime.
- Encouraging "thank-you moments" have your child write or draw a note to someone who has helped them.

- Celebrating kindness notice when your child shows gratitude or generosity, and let them know how proud you are!
